In such circumstances, CLASP will agree to the changes with the Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the CLASP. CLASP will promptly disclose the updated ESCP. Depending on the project, the ESCP may also specify the funding necessary for completion of a measure or action.
- 6. Where the Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the CLASP shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
