ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

1. CLASP is planning to implement the **Quality Assurance Capacity Building for the Off-Grid Solar Sector Project (the *Project*)**. The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (hereinafter the Bank) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
2. CLASP will implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the World Bank Environmental and Social Standards (**ESSs**). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (**ESCP**) sets out a summary of the material measures and actions.
3. The table below summarizes the material measures and actions that are required as well as the timing of the material measures and actions. CLASP is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP.
4. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Bank by CLASP as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Bank will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
5. As agreed by the Bank and CLASP this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, CLASP will agree to the changes with the Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the CLASP. CLASP will promptly disclose the updated ESCP. Depending on the project, the ESCP may also specify the funding necessary for completion of a measure or action.
6. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, CLASP shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
